Assisted Living Residence COVID-19 Related Reporting Requirements

Reporting to MA Department of Public Health via REDCap

Effective July 6th, and pursuant to <u>Chapter 93 of the Acts of 2020</u> Assisted Living Residences should report daily to DPH if/when there are any changes in the number of cases or deaths among residents and staff using the secure platform, <u>Research Electronic Data Capture (REDCap</u>). You must submit a facility contact form in the REDCap system regardless of whether your facility has confirmed cases of COVID-19. DPH is required to collect demographic information about each case and death, including: gender, race, ethnicity, disability, primary city/town of residence, age, primary language, and occupation. Please note that in addition to ongoing, positive case-based reporting, you must also submit a form for each confirmed case of COVD-19 dating back to March 10th, 2020 by no later than July 31, 2020.

Reporting Cases of COVID-19 to EOEA

All cases of COVID-19 should be reported to EOEA as an incident report. Only <u>one</u> incident report should be submitted describing COVID-19 for each individual Resident. The Incident Headline should indicate "COVID-19."

- If a resident was sent out to the ER to be evaluated for an incident unrelated to COVID-19 (i.e. Fall, Behavioral event) and is tested while out at the ER and confirmed to be positive, this should be a *new* IR *separate* from the original incident. The new IR should be submitted with an Incident Headline of "COVID-19."
- COVID-19 testing should <u>NOT</u> be reported as a Facility-Wide IR.
- UPDATED 11/25/2020: Due to resident health-risk from inadvertent interaction with nonresidents (Employees, Private Caregivers, Outside Providers, and Independent Living Residents active in the ALR community) who have tested positive, EOEA has requested that all known COVID-19 positive testing results be reported on a DAILY basis, using <u>THIS SURVEY</u> as of 12/07/2020

Reporting to Residents, Representatives and Families:

Pursuant to <u>Chapter 93 of the Acts of 2020</u>, Assisted Living Residences are required to inform residents, their representatives, and families of those residing in facilities of confirmed or suspected COVID-19 cases in the facility among residents and staff. The communication must occur by **5 p.m. the next calendar day** following the occurrence of *either*:

- A single confirmed infection of COVID-19; OR
- Three or more residents or staff with new-onset of respiratory symptoms that occur within 72 hours of each other.
